The Glen Rock Recreation Board met Tuesday, June 21, 2011 at the GR Community Park. Chairman Hufnagel called the meeting to order at 7PM; attendees: GRRB members, newly appointed Anne Creamer, Ferree, Flemmens, Hufnagel; guests: Sue Good, Ken Krebs, Sandy Fair, Lucy Cadwallader.

Secretary minutes from May were approved, motioned by Ferree.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Sandy Fair reported that PA Dig was contacted to mark utilities in preparation for the installation of the memorial walkway. She also reported that John Gersch and John Lackey would do the concrete and stone work and that Tim Shearer would lay the bricks. Pavers will be used to access the walkway and it will be WC accessible. Fair will contact Greg Fink regarding the possible placement of pavers at the flag pole lights. Fair also reported that the bricks will be removed from the storage room at the park to provide space for the summer program supplies.

Flemmens to meet with Council President Shiles to discuss council's decision to approve only 2 of 5 assistants for the summer program related to submission of receipts of background checks. Approved were Kate Jones and Breanne Chandler and Rebecca Rohrbaugh as director; those not approved were Adam Bocek, Steven Lutz, and Krystal Steenwyk. Council approved the wages the GRRB proposed (3/15/11 minutes). If no additional assistants are approved the number of children attending the program may have to be restricted; currently 75 children are registered. After meeting with Shiles, Flemmens will contact board and Becky to determine if additional action must be taken.

NEW BUSINESS:



Hufnagel reported that he sent a 'letter of support' as requested for the borough's DCNR grant application.


S. Good reported that the tennis court will require a new net next year.

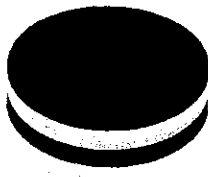


Hufnagel Public Library Upcoming Events:

BE PREPARED FOR EMERGENCIES

More than 234,000 calls were placed to York County's 911 center last year. That equates to approximately one call for every two York County residents.

It is vital that our community is prepared for emergencies before they happen. As part of the process, residents should ensure they know certain information about the places where they spend the most time. Providing this information to 911 operators helps them help you.

You should know:

- *The township, borough or city from which you are calling
- *Your phone number
- *Your address

Many 911 calls come from homes & workplaces so it's important to post this information prominently in those locations. Parents should teach their children this information & regularly reinforce it, particularly after a move.

There are times when the caller will not know this information. York County has one of the most advanced 911 systems in the nation. Our operators can trace your call to dispatch the appropriate team of responders. Every member of the community is encouraged to fill out an emergency card & post it in a prominent place.
